THE NEWCOMB RELIEF UNIT



The Newcomb Relief Unit

WHEN, during the spring of 1918, occasional alumnae and students wished aloud that Newcomb might be represented in war work in some definite and individual way, those who heard them echoed the wish, little dreaming that the winter of 1919 would find a unit organized and financed by the College, actively at work in Italy and in France. And those of us who worked to send that unit abroad sometimes wonder if we are not still dreaming.

To Dr. Dinwiddie, the President of the University, goes the credit for first suggesting that our vague wishes might actually be realized. It was in June that he took up the matter with the Alumnae President, Miss Anna Many. Members of the Alumnae were consulted, and waxed enthusiastic at once. And the Red Cross gladly accepted the offer of a self-financed unit of some ten members to do reconstruction work in devastated France. In July the first meeting was held, team captains were appointed, and work was actively begun. At the end of August it was possible to report that cash and pledges were enough to justify our belief that the unit was an accomplished fact. There were few very large contributions, either from the Alumnae themselves, or from outsiders; but the response was overwhelmingly cordial and overwhelmingly generous, and we can say that the Newcomb Unit is really a Newcomb Unit, supported, not by a few people, but by the great body of Alumnae and students of the College.

Applications for service, as might be expected, poured in, and the task of selection was a difficult one. In reaching a decision as to the constitution of the Unit, many things were considered: good health and endurance, a definite training in things likely to be of service, a knowledge of French, and—though it was never the first consideration—the amount of money the applicant could herself supply. Originally ten members were selected—circumstances later compelled one or two withdrawals and substitutions, and the list now stands: Caroline Richardson, '95, director; Anna Many, '07, business manager; Edna Danziger, '07; Celeste Eshleman, '06; Mary Palfrey, '09; Edith Dupre, '00; Marton Monroe, '10, and Nettie Barnwell, '09.

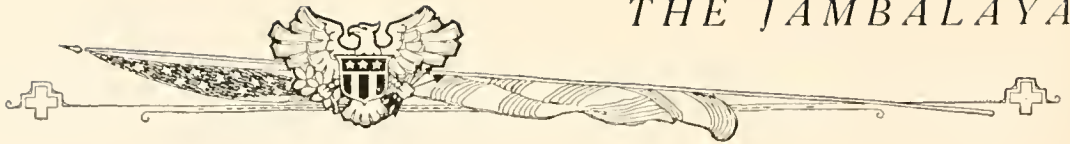
The Unit members began their training at once, and they learned everything, from first aid to auto-mechanics; from agricultural theories to cooking. They were vaccinated and inoculated. They read and talked French. And they provided themselves with all things that kindly friends suggested as necessary for one about to go overseas.

Then came the armistice, and a few days after the armistice came the announcement from the Red Cross that it could send no more units for service abroad. The Newcomb Unit forthwith made application to the Y. M. C. A. authorities, and was accepted at once, and on the night of December 15, they left for New York. There, so their stories go, they worked from seven in the morning until all hours of the night, filling in gaps in their education, as it were, and, between times, doing canteen work to get their hands in. And they passed more physical examinations.

On the eighth of January they sailed aboard the *Carmania*, with a motor corps unit, and units from Wellesley and Bryn Mawr. Mrs. George R. Vincent, of Chicago, was the head of the four units, and Newcomb is more than proud that Anna Many was business manager and Miss Caroline Richardson was one of the heads of the party. It lends assurance to what one of the Unit wrote, that Newcomb has never been so advertised in its life.

As yet we have only the faintest outlines of what happened after that. We know that the stay in England was brief, that Paris was reached late in January, and that the Unit was at once split up and put to work. Edith Dupre and Anna Many are in Rome; Celeste Eshleman and Marton Monroe are in St. Nazaire; Mollie Palfrey, Nettie Barnwell and Edna Danziger are doing canteen work in Briest; and Caroline Richardson is on special duty in Paris.

And because these things are so, we of Newcomb feel that we are doing as a body, our share in bringing peace and sanity back to a war-torn world, and we are grateful to those of us who had the vision and the courage to dream the dream that all of us have been given the opportunity to realize.

Junior Arts and Science History

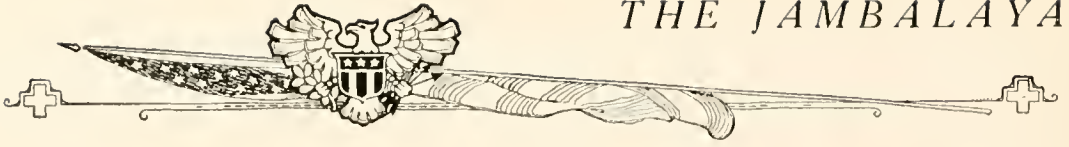

This course was carefully followed, as the record of the class shows:

In the inter-class tugs-of-war, it has never once been pulled through the pond. It has never been defeated in an inter-class debate. In the other inter-class competitions it has won as many victories as its policy would permit. At Tulane Night, both in 1917 and 1918, its originality and genius attracted popular attention. The members of the class have individually gone forward and won the highest offices in the university. It has been more than proportionately represented on all varsity teams. In every way possible, it has proven itself individually and collectively the greatest class ever at Tulane. But it firmly believed in the maxim that "fools' names and fools' faces, etc." and accordingly carefully limited its success to avoid the cheap publicity to be derived from gaudy-colored numbers painted on a vulgar water-tank, like any patent medicine might be advertised.

The test has gone far enough. Recognition and fame were the inevitable consequences of such a brilliant course as that of the Class of 1920; but they came sooner and more forcibly than expected. Rather than see our university suffer further humiliation we step forth and bow to the acclaims of the multitude. With such glory in three short years, the future of such a class is inconceivable.

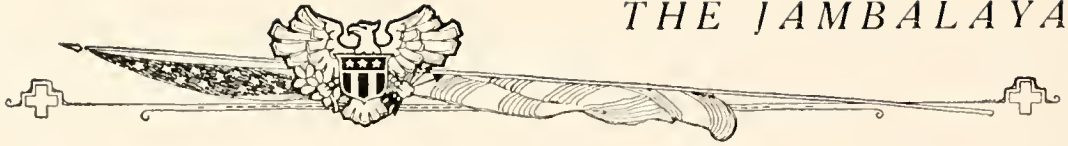

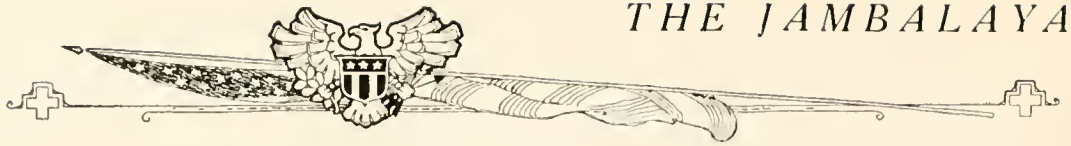

After things had settled down the class was organized. We were wearing the green caps as has been the custom of all self-respecting Freshmen classes.

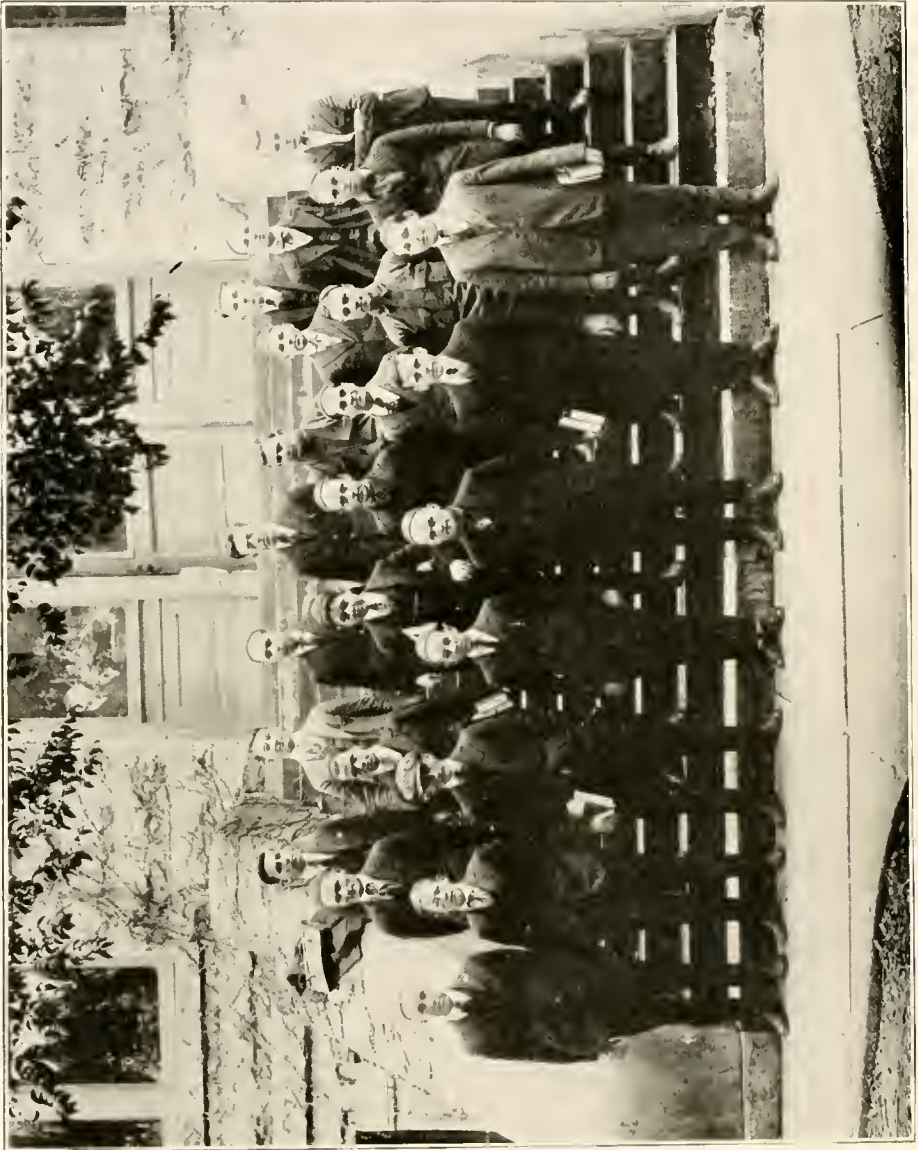

Senior Medical Class History

W

HEN the subject of history is mentioned to a member of the Medical Class of 1919, he proudly speaks up "that's us all over." For to write a history that would do justice to the Class of 1919 would require the most earnest efforts of one as "Buddie" (he has been writing a book for five years). So for reasons enough it will be necessary to mention in this brief sketch only the greater things concerning our life as a class.

During the month of September, 1914, Tulane bid welcome to its keeping, a group of sixty-five earnest, ambitious individuals, filled with vigor and determination to master the art of healing. Now, this is an extremely fine point in anatomy and one that will prove very beneficial to the future patient that may come for treatment. And so "My Babies" were instructed into the mysteries of chemistry (still a mystery) and judging from the interest taken by most members of the class, these lectures were of a great benefit (they were asleep).

At the conclusion of the first year all members of the class, with few exceptions, were qualified as Sophomores. It was during the Sophomore year that the real value of the class was appreciated. We soon learned the reason for calling certain objects "Dendrites" and others "Neurones." Then the act of catching an organism on a plate of culture media and telling why it was "This and not That" was indeed a small test for our class, as even the "King" readily admitted we were the best yet. After learning all offered concerning organisms, we acquired a vast knowledge of Pathology with the kind guidance of "Focus, Max!" That phrase lingers in our minds more forcibly than any Pathology lecture. During this year, too, we were introduced into the mysteries of Physiology under the new professor of that department, Dr. W. E. Garry, formerly of Washington University. It was here we discovered the fact that a dead frog can withdraw his foot from an irritating acid and that a dead turtle can maintain the rhythm of its heart beat. To impress upon a faculty member the fact that medical students appreciate their "mess" and to imbue the spirit of punctuality, certain members of our class deemed it wise to purchase an alarm clock. On this eventful day only the alarm clock remained for the lecture. It was also during this year that we decided that the idea of holding exams at night was not within keeping of our ideals. In respect to our wishes the faculty abolished night exams. Now the future classes are no longer subjected to the ordeal of suffering an examination from 7 p. m. to 10:30 p. m., and then washing away their sorrows and down the joys from 1 a. m. to 5 a. m. and then back all fresh for a good day's work. During this year it was our privilege to contribute a few of our members to the great World War. Those that remained did so with the keen sense of duty, prompted with one desire to prepare themselves for the great conflict when needed.

The beginning of our third year opened wide the avenues for new thought. The impressive walls of the hospital and clinics, holding within all the various degrees of suffering, each an interesting story to itself. During this year with the untiring efforts of our instructors the battles of the medical man were unfolded, and the responsibilities of those who have for their mission the relief of suffering impressed upon us. With earnest and untiring efforts we fought the battles of this year, during which we acquired much valuable knowledge. Then after due reckoning by those in whom our fate rested, we were pronounced ready to ascend to the dignified position of Senior.

Here as Seniors our class has been a dominant factor in University life. We started the year under a very serious handicap—all of our members were in the S. A. T. C.—enough said. During the great influenza epidemic all the members of our class lived up to traditions and rendered noble and efficient medical service to the suffering of Louisiana.

In reviewing now the final personnel of our number it is with regret that as we call the first name on our roll, Phillip McKinley Awtrety, we are reminded that for this member final taps have sounded; a genial fellow, liked and regretted by all. Due to various causes, many of the original class have withdrawn from our ranks, but we have had the pleasure of welcoming amongst us students from other universities.

Now for the last stretch and then over the line. The members of the Class of 1919 look out on the world with confidence. And as we part, each individual to a different section of our country, it will be our constant endeavor to so conduct our lives that we may uphold the dignity of our ancient and noble profession and do honor to the grand old name—Tulane—the peer of them all, located in the fair land of Dixie. Adieu!

Junior Medical Class History



THREE years ago we, the present Juniors, entered the Freshman Medical Class of Tulane with the determination to collect our scattered thoughts and ideas which were wandering in various and sundry places and concentrate them upon one theme, Medicine. The backwoods of nearly every Southern State was represented, and the map of each State was stamped indelibly upon the face of its representative.

We plodded through the Freshman year with its trials and tribulations and unsavory tasks. How well we can all recall climbing those old stairsteps at 1:30 P.M. every day in the week, every week in the month, and every month in the eight, with that back-breaking Anatomy balanced on our right hips. Not to save our lives could we get the connection of being a physician with the tasks assigned us, such as differentiating between a muscle tendon and a peripheral nerve.

In this sea of darkness we passed from the Freshman to the Sophomore year.

While Sophomores one of our professors gave us the name of "A Lazy Class." We won't attempt to deny this, but we do wish to state that it was only a matter of self-preservation. After a hard day's work "Chasing Frogs" around the Physiology Laboratory; performing painless operations upon dogs; counting the wrinkles in some poor fellow's brain in the Neurology Laboratory; juggling cocci, bacteria and spirella in the Bacteriology Laboratory, we had to be lazy the rest of the day to give nature a chance to repair the awful destruction of body tissues.

During this year we did get a ray of light through the darkness of what we were going to be, but we must admit that we were still in a cloud when we passed from the Sophomore into the Junior year, which was destined to be one of the most memorable of our lives.

On September 27, 1918, we presented ourselves as of yore for registration as Juniors. We found everything in confusion, due to the fact that the whole student body was to be inducted into the S. A. T. C. as provided by the Government. By the middle of October we were all established in barracks at Camp Martin and then indeed the clouds overhead opened and poured forth trouble, that they had withheld for centuries. It landed squarely upon our heads and bowed us to the ground underneath its weight. Some of our classmates were wise and lucky enough to enlist in the Navy, and there their troubles ended. But let me come back to the rest of us who were destined to endure as men had never endured before. At about this time the "flu" made its entrance into the drama which was being played, and the result was quarantine. Right then we stopped being students and started being soldiers. Out of bed at 5:45 A.M. and so on; the regular old army routine which is useless to repeat, for it is as familiar to us all as our A, B, Cs. To give us variety, such things as K. P., fatigue, scattering cinders, *et cetera*, were mixed in to prevent life growing monotonous. We were assigned to K. P. duty to receive

through instruction in the army's culinary department, and, by the Great Horn Spoon, we got it. We soon came to the conclusion that we were in a concentration camp for cooks and waiters, whose paramount duty was to supply men for kitchen duty in France. And drill, only seven hours a day, that's all. We were quick-timed to our meals, quick-timed to classes, quick-timed to the University at night for study period until it became such a habit to us to be quick-timed that we actually ate and slept at quick time.

Deliverance, for on the morning of the 11th of November the armistice was announced to the world. Up until this time we had supposed that the Government was to pay our tuition, but the Government supposed otherwise when the world war ended. Therefore we were kicked out, not put out, upon a cold world, not physical, but financial wrecks. Most of us took up the thread of our medical work where it had been broken, while others took up with the "flu."

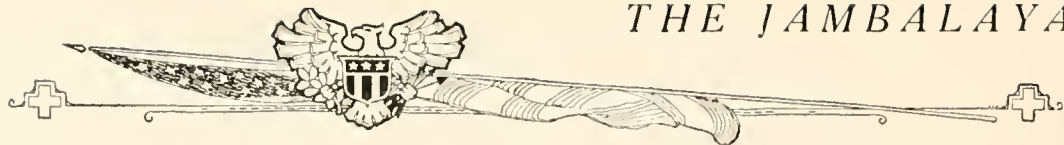

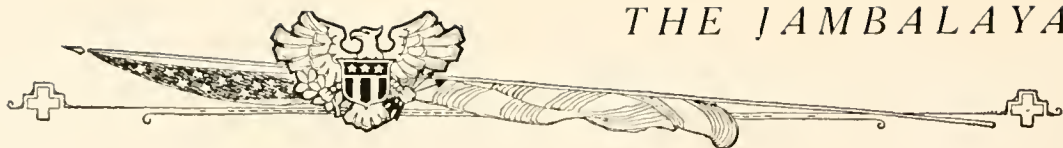
Mr. William Nail, known as "Fack with the point up." Possibly there is a chance for him in his future life if he will only use his "God-given gift of reason."

The debates are to be held in Gibson Hall every other Tuesday evening at 7:30 o'clock. The subject of each debate is to be different.



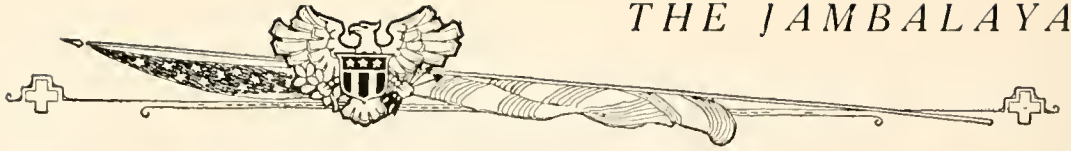

The 1918 Tulane Summer Survey Camp

Review of 1918 Football Season

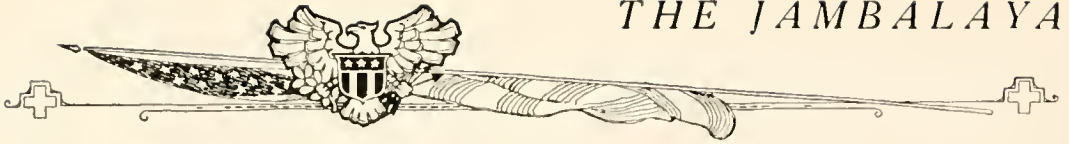

Track



TULANE had no track team during the season of 1918. The men who took part in track events had gone either to the army or to the navy. As a result it was decided to abandon track events for the season of 1918 and resume them again in 1919, provided military proceedings permitted. Now that the famous "dual meet," Allies vs. Deutschland et Alli, or Right vs. Might, has been decided in favor of the plaintiff, and no appeal, but quite a bit of whining—from the defendant, the Athletic Council has decided to put forth every effort to have a favorable track season this year.

There is to be more attention given to inter-class and inter-department athletics this year than ever before at Tulane. In this manner every student has a chance to take part and get some benefit from the training. The inter-class and inter-department meets give the new men a chance to show what they can do, and it also helps them to overcome that nervousness and lack of confidence that a new man is likely to feel in a regular meet against experienced athletes. These meets are naturally an incentive to bring out more men for athletics, for a man who has no chance to make the varsity team will not waste time in trying, but he has an opportunity to make a class or department team and will work to do so, thus getting valuable training and probably in the meantime developing into a good man.

Coach Shaughnessy is to coach the team this year. There is plenty of material in the University to develop the best track team ever turned out at Tulane. Such men as Simpson, Colee, Dabezies, Gladney, Barr, Fields, Browne, O'Reiley, etc., with some training can hold their own against any men in the South. As yet no captain has been elected. Simpson is manager of the team for this year.

Due to conditions at all universities in the South this year, there will be few dual meets. Tulane and L. S. U. will have their annual dual meet, probably in New Orleans. Other meets with Mississippi A. and M. and Rice Institute are being arranged. This present potentiality for a good team, can be, by proper training and coaching, an actuality by the end of May.

HOUGH greatly handicapped, due to war conditions, Tulane has succeeded in rounding up a Basketball team which should be able to hold its own with any team in this section.

Tulane suffered greatly in losing "Cajin Legendre, the star guard, and Captain M. A. Moench, the star forward, the latter was unable to play this year due to a bad heart, but volunteered his services to the T. A. A. and is coaching the 1918-1919 aggregation.

The veterans on hand this year were Gentling, varsity guard 1917-18 and 1918-19; Clay, center 1916-17 and 1918-19; Cassagne, guard, 1915-16 and 1918-19; Clem Dabezies, forward 1916-17 and 1917-18 and 1918-19. The latter being Captain for the last season. The rest of the team was composed of O. H. Dabezies, former St. Stanislaus guard; Sam Alcus, guard, and John Wight, Tulane's star football end, played center.

Tulane has already romped St. Stanislaus College, Manual Training and Spring Hill. Due to a late start, Tulane's schedule is not yet complete. But games with Young Men's Gymnastic Club, Camp Shelby, Rice Institute, La. State Normal, Shreveport A. C., and various other teams are pending. L. S. U. was on the string for awhile but they couldn't stand the pace and had to disband.

12. To be especially watchful at the table, and during the time of eating, to allow no one to get more prunes than myself.

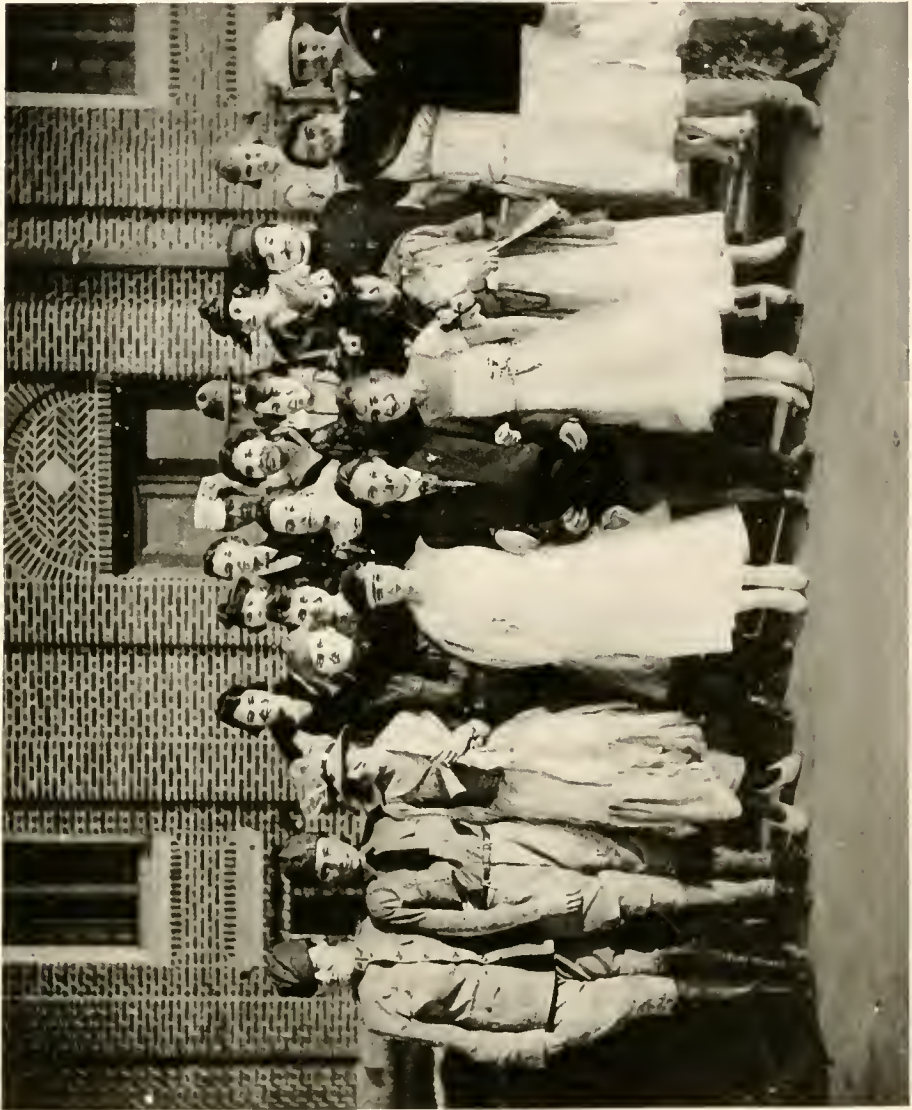
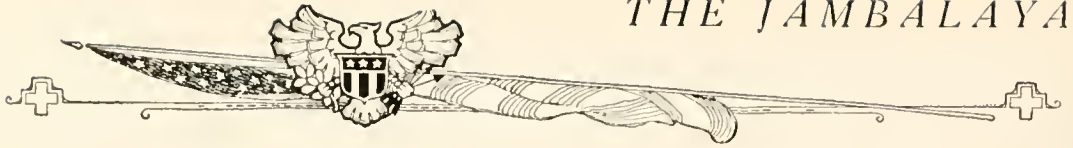

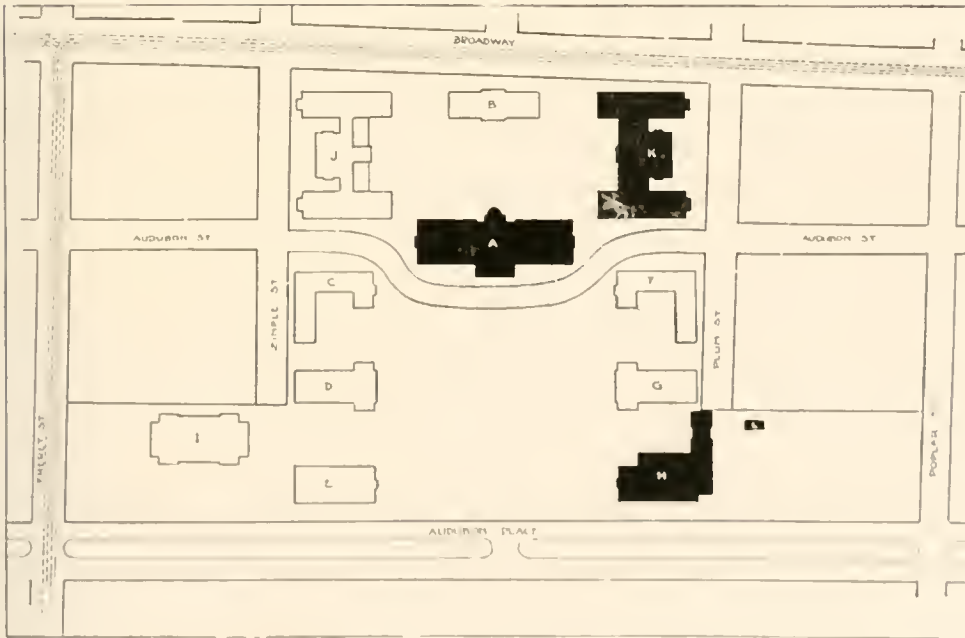
