The pupils are provided for very nicely in all buildings except North Clarendon. This building is not adequate for the number of pupils enrolled, and the prospects are for a larger increase in the near future.

The Parent-Teachers' Associations in the various districts have done a great deal for the improvement of the school plants and deserve much credit for this commendable work.

Four schools of the town are now "Standard" and the other three could be made so without very great expense. It would be well to take advantage of state aid in this particular.

The hearty co-operation of school directors, citizens and teachers is largely responsible for the present status of these institutions.

The educational progress in Clarendon is substantial and I appreciate the faithful efforts of all concerned for the general welfare of the children.
